


Moloka'i

FAST FACTS

- * **SIZE** – 61km long and 16km wide
- * **WEATHER** – 21to 29.5°C. Cooler temperatures at higher elevations.
- * **ACTIVITIES** – snorkelling, hiking, golf, stargazing, whale watching (Dec-Apr) and mountain biking.
- * **TRANSPORTATION** – with no public transport and limited taxis it's best to hire a car (make reservations in advance).

Celebrate

Serene. Unspoiled. Untamed. Visit Moloka'i and travel back in time to an island steeped in Hawaiian traditions and tucked away from the busy outside world. No structure is taller than a coconut palm. There is no traffic and not one set of traffic lights. On Moloka'i you'll discover unique, stress-free and intimate alternatives for your special day. Access is easy: the island is only 30 minutes by propeller plane from Honolulu.

THE PERFECT BACKDROP

Moloka'i offers spectacular locations for weddings, anniversary celebrations and vow renewal ceremonies, including stunning resorts and breath-taking white-sand beaches such as the dreamy, white-sand beach of Pāpohaku on the west coast.

Unwind

DIVE with schools of beautifully colourful fish in Hawai'i's largest reef extending 45km along the southern shore. It's one of the best dive sites in Hawai'i.

STARGAZE unaffected by streetlights. The stars will never seem so bright and mesmerising.

RIDE an unforgettable 5km via mule through Kalaupapa National Park. The views along the coast are out of this world!

EXPLORE breathtaking Halawa Valley or east of Kaunakakai along the scenic coast; wander through the magnificent rainforests of Kamakou Preserve; or hike through the spectacular Pāla'au State Park.

CELEBRATE the sunset over the shimmering water at Pāpohaku Beach or the ancient Kapuāiwa Coconut Grove – the best spots on the island to watch an unobstructed sunset.

BE OVERWHELMED with the sight of breaching humpbacks from December to April.

BOOK A HOT TABLE at Paddlers Inn (seafood) in Kaunakakai; Maunaloa Room at Moloka'i Ranch; Moloka'i Pizza (Kaunakakai); and Hula Shores restaurant (Hotel Moloka'i, Kaunakakai).

FAST FACTS

- * **SIZE** – 29km in the longest direction
- * **WEATHER** – 21to 29.5°C. Lāna'i City is 518 metres above sea level so it's noticeably cooler than on the coast.
- * **ACTIVITIES** – swimming, dolphin watching, snorkelling, diving, golf, hiking, four-wheel driving, stargazing and mountain biking.
- * **TRANSPORTATION** – with no public transport and limited taxis it's best to hire a car/4WD (make reservations in advance).

Lāna'i City:	10 min
Mānele Bay:	25 min
Shipwreck Beach:	40 min

Celebrate

Away from the crowds, Lāna'i is a destination of untouched tranquility. Enjoy the elegance of two exquisite Four Seasons resorts; unwind at the historic Hotel Lanai in charming Lāna'i City; and explore the enchanting lunar landscape of Keahikawelo (Garden of the Gods).

Access is easy: the island is only 45 minutes by ferry from Lāhainā (Maui) or 25 minutes by propeller plane from Honolulu.



THE PERFECT BACKDROP

Lāna'i offers spectacular locations for celebrations of all types including two luxurious five-star resorts – the beachfront Four Seasons Resort Lanai at Manele Bay and the country manor-style Four Seasons Resort Lanai, The Lodge at Koele. For an informal yet dramatic setting, you can't go past secluded Kaiolohia Bay (Shipwreck Beach).

Unwind

RE-ENERGISE, unwind and surrender to the luxurious pampering at The Spa at Manele Bay. An unforgettable experience.

HIRE a 4WD and set off on an adventure to the Garden of the Gods, Keahikawelo, where a spectacular lunar moonscape awaits.

DISCOVER an ocean-side paradise in Hulapo'e Bay. This well-protected pocket beach is one of Hawai'i's best, with clear, calm waters and variety of marine life including colourful reef fish and protected species such as green sea turtles. For intimacy and romance it's hard to find a better spot.

HIKE the challenging 11km Munro Trail to Lāna'i Hale and be rewarded with sweeping views of the entire island and at least three (sometimes six) of the neighbouring islands.

BOOK A HOT TABLE at Blue Ginger Café; The Ocean Grill at Four Seasons Mānele Bay Hotel; Hulopo'e Court at Four Season Hotel at Mānele Bay; and The Terrace at Four Seasons Lodge at Kō'ele.

Sweetheart Rock

On the southern coast of Lāna'i, rising from the sea, is the iconic Pu'u Pehe (or Sweetheart Rock). This picturesque natural landmark is steeped in an Hawaiian legend that tells of two lovers, a maiden named Pehe and a young warrior named Makakehau, who are tragically separated when Pehe drowns in a storm. Stricken with grief, Makakehau climbs the steep rock island where he buries Pehe and then jumps into the pounding surf below.
